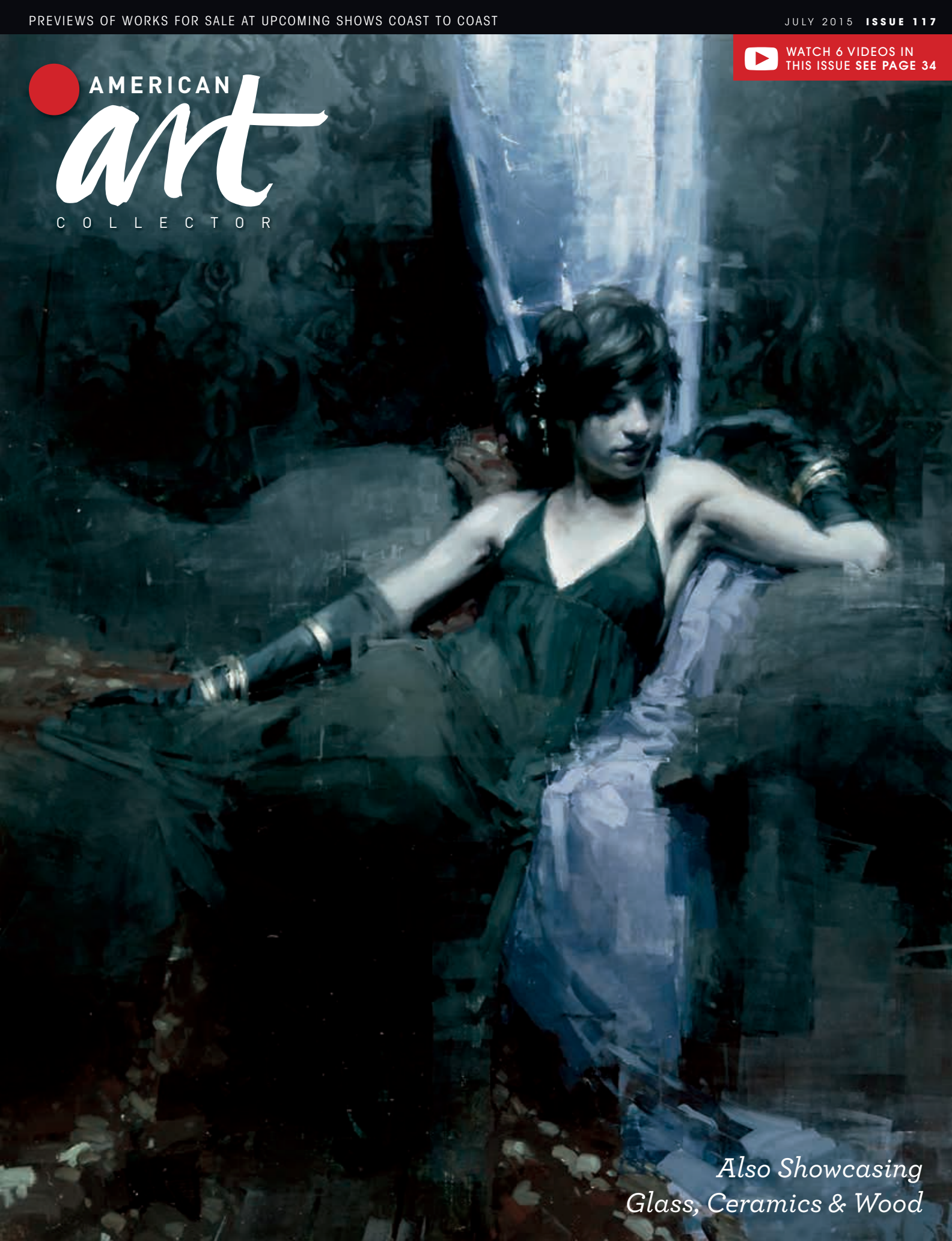

contemporary artists inspired by Edward Hopper and the Cape.

Other shows at the gallery include *Vistas and Vignettes: A Dialog with Color and Light* with works by **Robert Abele** and **Cynthia Reid**; and an annual solo exhibition for **Olivier Suire Verley**.

Joining Addison Art Gallery this year is artist **Paul Baldassini**. His dedicated study of 16th-century and

other master painters, combined with his vast knowledge of modern painting techniques and digital tools, results in contemporary realist paintings that appeal to art collectors who appreciate both how a painting is created and the natural beauty of the subject portrayed in a painting. Through discipline and assiduous study, Baldassini attends to details that give his paintings a mannered but nonetheless arresting quality.
